

## **Buongiorno studenti d'Italia!**

Greetings from Lithuanian students! On the 14th of November, an international meeting of leaders of European student resistance movements took place. This was the meeting where we met with one of your members Florio Scifo, the secretary of the international human rights association "Associazione Libera-mente Umani" and a member of the directive board of the Italian group "Studenti contro il Green Pass". Each of us shared experiences on restrictions that we are facing in our countries as well as what we can do about it at the international level. Not surprisingly, we've got the impression that we all live in the same country as the situation is very similar everywhere. Why is it so? We are all dealing with an emerging global system in which big companies play a very important role. At this point, it would be interesting to know what the competition authorities do? Is there not a desire to investigate what is happening at the moment? Does it not seem that the power of the big companies has been pushed to a limit that is hard to comprehend? If they still want to protect consumer welfare, why are they doing nothing?

As we all know, the European Union has entered into contracts with private pharmacy companies, whereby it has COMMITTED itself to purchase vaccines in huge quantities, more than a few years in advance. Nobody cares whether or not the virus will still exist at that time (nobody is able to know for sure), but the contract will certainly exist and will have to be respected. A whole new legal system is being developed so that countries can comply with this treaty. Nobody is interested in the supreme legislation in our countries that contradicts this treaty. Nobody is interested in human rights. States are becoming branches of big companies and officials are becoming advertising agents. The mechanism of oppression is aimed at maximising profits.

This new system is underpinned by digital vaccination passports and so the real world is increasingly becoming virtual. Both education and work are becoming more and more virtual. The paradox is that the more digital it becomes, the less attention goes to human rights, likewise, the more jobs are lost. After all, we are all in favour of science, we are all in favour of technology and progress. However, it is the human being who must be at the forefront of these things. A person has to stand tall, with rights and a job, healthy and educated. And above all, such a person must stand in a free and independent country!

So if we want to protect our rights, we must defend ourselves against this global system. The only way to do this is to unite at the international level. We, Lithuanian students, greatly support and admire your movement, and we have seen and heard about your achievements. We call on everyone, let us build an international system, let us support each other because only the system can fight against the system. Best of luck! Our strength is in unity!
